Meeting Attendance: 44 members plus one guest.

Treasurer: \$6,972.61 balance reported. Website costs are down \$130 from 2018, newsletter costs down \$276, exhibit expenses down, luncheon expenses increased \$132. The board agreed to reimburse Betsy and Barbara \$150 each for the costs of providing refreshments for the past 2 years. Donations to the monthly refreshment jar are down considerably from previous years.

First Vice-President's Report: A sign-up sheet for programs for 2020 was circulated.

Second Vice-President's Report: Rodger reminded everyone that the proceeds from the December auction go to the club to help replenish the treasury. This is the only fund-raising event the club has each year. If you want a receipt for your donation, see Roger.

Old business: A motion to remove the tabled motion from consideration to partner with Tiger Collectibles for a stamp show was made, seconded and passed. A revised proposal for a joint effort between Tiger Collectibles and MPS was presented. A motion to approve the new proposal was made and seconded. After discussion, the motion was passed. The proposal is as follows:

Purpose: Assist Tiger Collectibles in hosting a new two-day show in the first half of the year going forward.

MPS to provide:

Request mailing list of APS members from American Philatelic Society for use for announcing the show. These are provided to the organization for the cost of shipping the mailing labels.

Provide members as registration/greeters during the show.

Allow Tiger Collectibles to use the MPS non-profit status to negotiate with meeting space providers. This could lower the price of the venue.

Provides frames and exhibits if room is available.

Tiger Collectibles to provide:

Advertising of the MPS in all mailings (USPS/email/social media) and at the registration table. If a show program I s produced, MPS will be featured.

20% of the profit (if any) from table rent, will go to MPS.
