Head out for a great stamp day to:



We must be out be 5pm, so be ready to bid, pay with cash and pickup your auction lots.






1934-2022

Bill's wife, Charity Gourley, sent the following note to Tomas....



# USS Oklahoma to the Rescue by Michael Keil

At the beginning of 1936, the *USS Oklahoma* (BB-37) was transferred from the Pacific Fleet to the East Coast. That summer, *Oklahoma*, along with *Wyoming* and *Arkansas*, was chosen to participate in the annual Midshipmen's Cruise to Europe, visiting several ports. On board *Oklahoma* was William Backman, a member of the *Oklahoma*'s band. He sent several letters home to his wife, some mailed ashore from local post offices.

While *Oklahoma* was at Cherbourg, France, civil war broke out in Spain. The American consul at Bilboa requested ships be sent to evacuate Americans who were in Spain on vacation or for business. Oklahoma, being the largest of the 3 ships was selected for this duty.

Over the next 34 days, the ship made 6 trips to various Spanish ports, evacuating 179 people, including one pregnant woman who gave birth on board the ship, the only baby born on an American battleship



Rubber stamp "Refugee" cachets were applied to *Oklahoma* covers during the crisis. These appear in red and blue ink with variations in the wording. "Aiding Refugees Bilboa, Spain," "Landing Refugees Bayonne, France," and other messages were applied.
